Living with Kids While in the D/s Lifestyle

How does one raise kids in a D/s household? As one with several kids I thought I should talk just a moment on this. It does interest me how others deal with this so I would like to know how others feel as well.

My own history of being raised in a D/s household (unbeknownst to me) my entire life also puts me in a unique position to speak on this as well. It is obvious to me now how my folks are and the thought had crossed my mind once I became aware there was a whole underground community at the age of 18. But until it was stated clearly I would have never known for sure.

In most ways my owner and I approach this thing very much as my parents did. They did as much as possible to shield me from their unique lifestyle as do we. And just like they did I imagine there will be a day when I (or my owner) will have an honest open conversation about such things. I want them to know there is a lifestyle that exists like this, and make their own decisions about what to do with that knowledge. Unlike my mother though, I will try to tell them at some point in their life when it will be helpful to them if they need that. I suspect one or two of them may be exactly like us. As an adolescent I struggled with my strange thoughts and feelings. It never even occurred to me there were others like me. And it was happening right in my own home! It would have been some helpful knowledge at that time.

But for now it is my priority as a parent to not spoil their innocence in any way. It is a precious thing and my children are a far higher priority than this life I lead. Don't misunderstand, we are very serious about our lifestyle, and it does not take a break ever. But when it comes to my children they just don't need to know about this thing right now.

It must be ridiculously obvious to my children who "wears the pants" in the family. But they think only that. I don't address my owner with things like "mistress" or even call her my "owner" with the children about. We do have ways of communicating that are our secret way when they are about. We have code words for different things that mean one thing to a bystander but a completely other thing to us.

There are obvious and subtle ways that one can serve without making ones submission obvious. You are just simply fulfilling the things that need to be done about the house. Like making breakfast, picking up the kids from school, doing the grocery shopping, and a thousand other mundane tasks your owner may not particularly enjoy. While those of us who enjoy service will be very happy to do those things.

Now BDSM play is a whole other matter entirely of course. I know this sort of thing is probably not an option for a lot of people, but this is one reason we hired a nanny for the kids. She manages to keep them busy and away from the house on activities quite often. And even our teenager enjoys going out with them from time to time, but being a teenager she also has her own life and priorities at the moment, and most times that does not involve hanging around her boring parents. Most of the time she goes out with her girlfriend and they are gone for as long as we allow her.

There are numerous things in BDSM that one can do to be discreet while living with children. Wax play, needles, bondage on its own is quiet of course, and if you want to do the spanking thing there are numerous implements that are themselves silent. Now keeping a sub quiet is another matter entirely but that is where a good ball gag comes in handy. There is also something called [figging](#), which by a quick look around the Internet I see has become quite popular.

So having kids can be a challenge in this lifestyle but I do recommend being honest with them at some point in their life. They deserve to come to this

knowledge just as much as other things in this life. What they choose to do with said knowledge should be up to them. Try not to be disappointed when they choose one way or the other too. Remember they are doing that because it makes them happy. You will have to trust them that they (or their owner) will keep themselves safe.

D/s with Family Around

Perhaps one of the most challenging decisions we face as a parent is what we should tell our children, when and how much. By choosing to live within the D/s or BDSM lifestyle the normal sexual issues exist with the addition of this serious added component.

It is important that we do not impose upon our children 'undue influence' to in some way persuade them into a position of agreeing with our personal choices in any manner or form. It is equally important that we consider and think about what it is we would like for them to understand in order for them to better understand us and the possibilities of their world as a whole.

It is improper to make or consider any 'attempt' to 'make' or direct our children into a 'next generation' D/s family. We, as adults, are willing to fight to protect our personal right to free and open choices in the decisions we take and the pathways we follow. We should equally protect our children's rights to follow the pathways that they desire in their life without any reverse judgment on our part.

The tools that children need to move forward into the world with a positive and open thought process are not in any way altered by whom their parents are and how their parents choose to live their intimate lives.

It is absolutely essential that we teach 'through our actions' the fundamental basics of human DIGNITY. Regardless of your 'position' or role within your intimate relationship you MUST present your belief and RESPECT in and for your partner to your children. You must present total support for them. Trust in them and be willing to express in the presence of your children your deep personal affection through loving touches and actions to and with your partner. Express your pleasure and joy in being WITH your partner!

These are the crucial tools and messages that we teach our children about how to interact in relationships with other people and how to love. When your child asks you a specific 'sexual' question you should answer that child without any sign of embarrassment (which will convey there is something wrong) in language appropriate to your child's age exactly and no more than your child asks to know. You should provide examples of various types of relationships to show your children that many exist and that those types are just choices the individual makes AS an adult. This should be done in a natural way by inviting friends to dinner etc. Children begin learning about their world, life and even sex from the moment they emerge into the world. They layer information on top of information as their curiosity and interest grows in any one area.

You SHOULD refrain from all overt demonstrations of D/s in the presence of your children and remember that such an open display violates their rights. Your child, as you, must exist in many worlds at the same time. Maintenance of their ego stability through actions which will not make them the unwarranted subject of humiliation and shame by their peers is part of your parental duties. Keep your toys locked up and out of plain view. Do NOT have either parent use 'ornamental' scene language in the presence of ANY children "such as the addressing of a spouse as Master, Sir, Mistress, Ma'am" Usage of this language can serve to embarrass the child and the parent and may indicate a disrespect for the parent before or in the view of their children which MUST not occur. Parents are of EQUAL rank and should be obeyed equally by the children.

Children can listen to sounds and 'be afraid' that something bad is happening. If your house is not acoustically paneled and you scene inside the house (in privacy) then your children are or will hear sounds. At some point if your child is having difficulty relaxing in the night when sounds most often occur, you may decide to sit down with that child (together) and tell that child that you (parents) enjoy being with each other at night and sometimes play games that make lots of strange sounds. You should tell them that it is just part of how you, as a couple, express love and that other people express love in other ways. None being more right or wrong than any other. Do remember to encourage privacy of your acts by LOCKING your door. Note: If you or your partner are 'unhappy' or 'afraid' this TOO will communicate to your children and may create a deep atmosphere of fear and anxiety.

D/s is NOT about abuse or physical retribution from one partner to another. If YOU are being struck in ANGER or struck with an INTENT to cause you pain and injury then your relationship is NOT Consensual but ABUSIVE.

A child should never see one parent strike another. NEVER. When you have an argument you should decide in advance how to address such a conflict. If you take your discussion to the dining table (when no meals are present) and engage in a 'conversation' with your spouse about the issue and possible solutions. Then you are inviting your children to 'listen in' on the problem solving process. You should avoid ANY placement of blame but consider issues that disturb the family to be simply problems to be solved. It is appropriate to apologize if it appears your part in the problem was in error and if you 'feel' this to be true. Retain your composure and if necessary schedule the solution session when you carry no personal 'heat' or anger about the incident or issue involved. Remember that viable solutions come from all sources and genuinely seek the advice and counsel of your mate. At the conclusion when the problem has led to a possible solution you can consider the sharing of say a dessert and coffee with your partner. This type of activity reassures your children that problems are solvable and that

solving them does not need to threaten the relationships of anyone.

If a child finds a play toy you should not lie to them. It is important to remember that the action of lying will remain with them and lead to a lessening of trust in you. Keep it simple. Tell them that it is just an adult toy.

By not making sexual topics 'secret' or mysterious they lose much of their glamour, especially for younger children. Most children find the activities of adults boring and often they really 'don't want to know'.

It should be the consideration of all parents to pay attention to the development of their children and to recognize that your children will hear about sex and sexual activities from a myriad of sources outside of you and your home. Sexual explorations can begin at a young age and though we may wish to keep our children 'innocent' we should always act to protect them from harm by proper education of the dangers inherent in ANY activity. It IS appropriate to have detailed conversations with your child at around the age of puberty about safety during sex and the diseases and problems which safe sex protects them from. If you don't know the basics of safe sex yourself ALL library systems have numerous books designed specifically for the use of parents with their children. Children will view your action to educate them as an expression of love and concern for their safety. If YOU consider it serious – so will they if that trust and respect in you and your opinion is sound.

Educate your child with factual data or other people will educate them with rumor. Do NOT make sex or sexual issues any more or less important than any OTHER facet of maturity. It is a part of natural human existence and is merely something each of us needs to learn to manage and enjoy safely.

Remember that safe sex changes as new products become available and new diseases emerge to threaten each of us. It is appropriate for each of us to take a refresher course from time to time to ensure the health of ourselves and those we

love.

...And Along Came Baby: Parenting and Submission

As a parent of 2 children and the active property of my Owner and Husband, I thought perhaps it was time to begin writing some about the trials and tribulations as well as the joys and experiences of the parent slave. I was surprised when I first began writing about this topic that no one had really covered it in depth previously to this, and so I am happy to add my voice to the very small, but very necessary conversation about submission and the responsibility of parenthood.

When I found out that I was pregnant (what a surprise that was! I was told I was infertile and I was on birth control to control my cycles!) Many people just assumed that we would drop the majority of our lifestyle to focus on family rearing. Nothing could be further from the truth! During the stressful times of having an infant and also further in to the terrible twos and fearsome threes I needed that structure and ritual to fall back on to give me a place of strength to return to when I wanted to rip my hair out. What was needed was to take a good close look at how we were operating as a couple and as Owner and property and tweak things so that it was no longer as obvious as it was to even the untrained eye. After all, children should never ever witness these kinds of acts between their parents, it can and will mess up their development.

I won't say it was easy, and it required an entire overhaul of how we did things but we were able with a few changes to fix our hierarchy, our rituals and our rules in such a way that I still felt bound by them and He still felt served. I want to give some examples here, so that anyone can adapt them themselves as well.

One rule that we had was I was always to greet him at the door when He came in, kneeling in the [nadu position](#), head bowed. This is obviously not something that I can do in front of the children! (I can hear the school teachers now, “your mother does what?!”) Now, when I know that He is to return home, and I see Him coming through the gate, I go to the front door and open it for Him and stand to the side with my head bowed and hands clasped in front of me, silent. He then draws me into an embrace and kisses me...thereby releasing me to go about my other duties or to inform Him of anything needful that happened while He was gone.

Another ritual that we had was I was to ask permission to enter any room that He was in and seated/resting in (not counting if He is working on something, fixing something etc.). Again this was not child friendly in the least, so we changed it around carefully so that it retained the meaning but was not so obvious. Now, I enter the room and walk over to Him and He will either nod, giving me permission to continue about my work or ask me to settle my wheelchair near Him so that He may speak with me about whatever is on His mind. When He is finished He will give me further instructions.

These are just two examples of how we have modified our rituals and protocols to allow for young eyes and ears, and also to make our ways of being much easier to keep in public. There are many more of course, and I encourage you to write and comment on further ideas that you may have or questions that may come up about how to work on something so that it fits a child filled home.

How to Deal With the Question of Being Kinky and a Parent

Some of us live our D/s lives out in the open, letting family and friends know who and what we are – and dealing with any fallout from people who don't understand the lifestyle. To you, I have much love and respect. I'm not there yet...and maybe I never will be.

Others, like myself, keep it completely separate from our vanilla lives. We create separate social media accounts, pseudonyms, and hide behind the anonymity of the internet. There's concern and sometimes, fear, of being outed as kinky.

Whichever way we handle our kinky lives, we often face a lot of the same questions and judgment from people on the outside looking in.

Show of hands...

How many of you think you can't be into kink, BDSM, or have a D/s relationship if you have kids?

How many of you get asked (too often, I might add) how you do it with kids?

For the first group, hold on to your seats. I think it's time to get some extra education. For the second group, let me share with you how I handle this question – and I do get it a lot.

First, you have to realize that the question of whether you can be kinky and a parent comes from one of two places. Either someone is genuinely confused because they still have a lot to learn about D/s and BDSM, or they're judging the lifestyle based on false information and preconceived notions.

Confused but Well-Meaning

When someone is genuinely trying to learn more about the lifestyle and wrap their mind around being kinky and being a parent, I try to be gentle with them. There is so much bad information out there about BDSM and D/s that it's easy for those just starting out to be confused.

My answer to this question?

My children never see anything overtly sexual. I've been fortunate that they've never caught us playing or found a toy, flogger, cane, or paddle. Only one time have they questioned something they heard. It was a quick smack on the ass while we were getting ready for the day. The boys were in their bedroom, we were in ours, but the walls were thin.

For our own reasons, they don't hear me call Southern Sir "Daddy" or even "Sir." Because he's like a stepfather to my kids (we're not married), they call him Mr. John, so I do, too. I consider it another honorific to use, specifically when my children are around or might be able to hear us.

What my children see are two people in a loving relationship who show each other respect at all times. They see us laugh, tease, and even fuss with each other. We learned our lessons from previous relationships, and we keep the big arguments between us, behind closed doors. They pretend to gag when we kiss in front of them. Typical parent/child stuff, y'all.

The tasks I may complete in front of them aren't overtly kinky. Making him a cup of coffee, serving him dinner, re-filling his drink. All of those are things I'm required to do, but they don't have a clue. They think Mom is just being nice and taking care of "Mr. John" the way I take care of them.

If the day comes that they have questions, we will answer them in an age-appropriate way that educates them without (hopefully, lol) scarring them for life.

For Those Who Just Don't Get It

Some people truly believe that you can't be a parent and a kinkster. I've seen people labeled a bad parent for being kinky! There are plenty of examples of kink being used against a parent in custody cases. Nothing gets my blood boiling hotter than some uneducated judgment being thrown around by people who believe they have all the answers. Grrrr...

How do I respond to these people? With a question of my own...

When asked how I can possibly be kinky as a parent (you know, in that tone that implies that I'm no better than a child abuser), my response is always the same.

Do you have vanilla sex with your kids in the same room?

No? Then why do you think I'm having kinky sex in the same room with my children? What specific examples of my behavior or that of anyone in the lifestyle makes you think that's what we're doing?

Oh, I see. Your entire education about kink, BDSM, and D/s comes from erotic fiction that may or may not be based on reality or porn which definitely has little basis in reality. You think submissives are all laying around naked, waiting for commands to be issued. Right? And clearly, we're so immoral we do this with our children around.

It makes steam come out of my ears every single time.

Here's the bottom line. Yes, you can be kinky and be a parent. Yes, you can be a 24/7 submissive and still be a parent. It's all about what you let your children see

and how you explain the things they may hear or see that you were trying to hide.

Find good hiding spots for your toys. Do everything you can to minimize noise or get your major kink on when they're not home. Let your children see the respect you have for your partner. And, like everything we do as parents, figure out what works best for your children based on their maturity level and age and for your family as a whole.

When Kids Find Your Sex Toys

My daughter found the key and rifled through our toybox about two years ago. She was 12. This absolutely and completely traumatized her. She had enough knowledge (most likely from the internet) to know what dildos and vibes and plugs were, cuffs and whips are pretty self-explanatory. Once it's found, there really is no denying it.

She didn't tell me at first. She told my mom. And she told the school counselor. There were no repercussions from the school, thank God (you worry about legal and child welfare things like that though). My mother, being the bible quoting, sex is dirty, masturbation sends you to hell type of woman that she is, spent long hours talking to my daughter about how wrong that stuff is. How there is something wrong with me, wrong with Master. I had no clue why my daughter was distancing herself from me. I didn't know what was making her so angry. She started fighting with me about letting her move in with her grandmother. I completely rejected the idea, of course! She's my daughter, no way was I going to let her go anywhere. My mother was also bugging me, telling me that I was

making her miserable, that I should just let her be happy.

Then my daughter threatened suicide if I didn't let her move out. I was floored. I honestly just didn't know what was going on. I was heartbroken. We had always had a good relationship, she was my first-born, my miracle baby as I had been told I would probably never have kids. And she just seemed to hate me.

To make a long story short (yeah, like I can do that.), she did move out, and about a month after that, she told me what she had seen. She told me how angry she was that I was being abused. She said the sex toys were disgusting. She said I was disgusting. Master was disgusting. Everything was disgusting! She couldn't stand to look at me, she said.

When you get confronted with that, your first instinct is to deny it. But how do you tell someone they didn't see what they saw? How is denial or lies going to make it any less confusing? I went through a few days of conflict over how much, if anything to tell her. At 12, she barely had the basics of relationships and sex. But I knew if I was going to get her back, I would have to talk. So talk I did.

Without going into intimate details of my own personal sex life, I explained as best I could, the toys, the whips, and the emotions involved. That it wasn't abuse. That it wasn't illegal. (She thought, probably from my mom, that those sex toys were illegal.) I told her that sex was much more than what she was learning in health class. That sex and intimacy is not disgusting, that it can and should be fun and exciting and meaningful and that's what the toys were for. That all different sorts of sensations, including a little pain, can be involved. That exploring what you like, with someone you love, is natural and normal.

I didn't go into the power exchange or the Master/slave stuff. I don't think she picked up on that, or at least she didn't ask about it.

She did move back home and while she has never again asked me about my toys,

she will ask me anything else. It was a hard road and could have ended badly, almost did, but in the end we are closer and more open. At 14 she's just starting her own explorations... first kisses and all of that. I like knowing she isn't afraid to talk to me now. She's asked me things like 'what does sperm taste like?' or 'what's up with butt sex, Mom?' And while each time my heart skips a beat and I still question how much info is too much, I at least know she'll come to me with things that arise.

I have two other kids who have no clue to this day why their sister moved out for that time. She's never told them about what she found and neither have I. What they have benefited from is the open and honest atmosphere that's developed. We are an affectionate, goofy, silly, fun family. Master makes no attempts to hide the fact that He finds me sexy, and vice versa. We'll often pretend to 'make out' if only to get the groans and "get a room" from the kids.

The toys have been moved to a padlocked cedar hope chest that sits in our bedroom. The kids believe it has Master's guns in it and He carries the key with Him. I don't call Him Sir or Master around them (though I have slipped a few times and hurried to cover it with a salute or a sarcastic comment, even taken to calling Him "My Lord" for shits and giggles. The kids think it's hilarious). Both of my daughters have started to take offense to the way I wait on Him and there have been a few conversations so far about that. Mostly what I stress to them is I do what I want to do, I do things to make Him happy because I love Him, the same as I do for them.

In this lifestyle, if you are living it, you take your chances with kids seeing or sensing things. And you learn to be careful and private too. My girls can no longer walk into the bathroom when I'm in the shower, I have too many scars that spell words..lol. That's not something I want to explain. The hooks in the bedroom ceiling hold a rope light in a frame around the bed, which is actually quite sexy and mood-inducing when we use it for the light. Various hooks in the basement

hold Master's tools, lawn stuff, bikes, chairs, etc. The excess of rope we really DO use for other things, like tying things down in the back of Master's truck, so the kids think nothing of those things.

But prepare yourself for the possibility of being outed. It can happen no matter how careful you are.

BDSM When the Walls Have Ears – 5 Strategies for D/s Play with Kids Around

No matter how you choose to go about it, kinky or vanilla, we want to keep our fun-loving activities away from our children. However, by their very nature, children are curious little people who can have quite the sneaky side and don't like missing what everyone is up to after bedtime has arrived.

I can distinctly remember one very thorough spanking I received, late at night before we went to bed, and our kids had been asleep for hours. Turns out our daughter woke up to use the bathroom and (thankfully she has a squeaky door we hadn't fixed, stopping our fun right then and there of course) but she came to find us afterwards and asked "why were you guys clapping?"

Since then, we have taken some more precautions when it comes to the noises that can come from our play.

1) Turn on the TV/radio. It took some getting used to for me because the sound was distracting and made it really hard to drop into subspace or even cope with some of the impact play (which normally isn't an issue). Keeping the TV or radio on means that there is a background noise that can be used to explain some of

the sounds that are happening, if they happen to wake. This is what I wish we had in that first learning moment we experienced.

2) Use a white noise machine in their room. Keeping some noise that is generated right in their room adds another layer of protection for you both. These little machines are often used for children who have trouble sleeping anyways, so it can help them get to sleep and stay asleep. You may also find success with bedtime stories on CD that play on repeat in their room.

3) Keep play as far away as possible from the kids room(s). Depending on your living space, you may have a few more options. Try to keep things as far away as possible to minimize being heard. It will also bring in some more creativity. I now know that the height of our desk is wonderful for me and being pressed up against the cool, hardwood is amazing. If you are still worried they may come and find you, baby gates are awesome to stop them in their tracks and to give you time to get yourself together before they see you.

4) Gags are a wonderful thing. If, like me, you can get quite loud, gags can be a wonderful thing. They can add some fun to your play but also make sure that some of the sounds are muffled right from the source. Ball gags tend to work better than spider gags but you can gag on some other things too, if that suits your fancy *wink*.

5) Explore quiet toys. What about being teased with a feather instead of your favourite crop tonight? Explore some options that may be less traditional and you may find some new "toys" that keep you on your toes that were right under your nose all along.

I know that these steps take extra time and attention but it is worth it to keep our children away from our lifestyle. It is so much more enjoyable for us when we can play without having to worry about them. What have you done to keep the noise levels to a minimum with little ones under the same roof?

These Aren't Your Toys!

Many of us love our kinky toys and the collection just keeps growing the longer you are in the community. Floggers, canes, crops, clothespins, candles, you name it. If you look around my house, those aren't the toys you will see – it looks more like an explosion of blocks, cars, dolls and books as far as the eye can see.

In an effort to keep our lifestyle to ourselves, we needed to put in some precautions to keep our adult toys out of reach and out of their imaginations.

How do I make sure they don't accidentally get into the toy chest?

Locks are a wonderful thing. As I clean up, I make sure that the toys get locked away. Both Master and I have a set of keys so they can be cleaned up and stored properly. You can put them in luggage bags and tool boxes – both have the advantage of looking very mainstream and the kids probably won't even question you having them.

Keep them out of reach. We have these wonderful shelves at the top of our closet that even I can't reach without help. This makes it the perfect place to keep items out of reach from the little hands. Another great place is the back of the closet. Other than a riveting game of hide-and-seek, there is often no reason to go into the back of the closet (and more importantly, our closet, even less reason to go there), so it keeps it out of their minds.

Clean up has to happen once the scene is over. Cuddles can be a wonderful part of aftercare for me and I could stay there all day if I was allowed. However, it also means that I could fall asleep and the kids could wake up while everything is still out. Just like I have to do the dishes completely before bedtime, the toys also

need to be put away promptly before we fall asleep. I am usually welcome to come back for cuddles once the toys are cleaned up and put away.

If you are using everyday household items for your play, let them be visible in the way they are commonly used. I keep clothes pins around to hang pictures on a string in their room (saves the tape on the walls). When the kids see clothes pins, they just think of their regular every day uses, so if one accidentally falls under the bed and they happen to see it, they figure I dropped it and there are no uncomfortable questions. The kitchen spoons and hairbrush also go back to their respective places. Let the kids see you using them the way that they normally would.

Try toys that don't need clean up – think of ice. Sure, it will melt, but a simple towel can solve that problem or in a worst case scenario, pretend you spilled your drink.

A bit of thinking ahead can help make sure that your fun stays between you and your Dominant. How do you clean up your space after a scene to make sure that the toys only found in the right hands? What "in plain sight" toys have you used to keep the spice alive but not raise any suspicions either?
